


### Real GDP Growth


### **Quarterly Real GDP**








Year-over-Year October 2016




### Labor Underutilization




National by Age Cohort


# Labor Force and Unemployment Rate




Q2 2001-Q2 2016


### Household Debt Burden








### National FHFA Home Price Growth

Year over Year Q3 2016








# Federal Budget Balance

### **Major Export Destinations**







### National Inflation















### Gross Farm Revenue and Net Income







- Innovation will play an increasing role for agriculture





## Housing Units vs. Households





2007-2017






Residential, 2007-2017

Nonresidential, 2007-2017






### WTI Oil Price






- Sixth-largest producing state



### Renewables


- First renewable portfolio standard in the country



Workers Added, 2007-2017











## Mesa County Wages


Annual Rate (4Q Rolling)

## Mesa County Average Wages



## 2015 Average Annual Wages







# Federal Housing Finance Agency Home Prices by MSA Q2 2015 – Q2 2016




# Federal Housing Finance Agency Home Prices by MSA CAGR Q2 2006 – Q2 2016





## Drilling Permits by County


